OBJECTively Speaking:

On Sunday May 4, 2008, Fuller Craft Museum's 'meet the artist' Series will feature Art Aspire Artist-in-Residence Linda Price-Sneddon.

Installation artist, Linda Price-Sneddon will talk about *My Nature/OUR Nature* and her experience working with Brockton teens as part of Fuller Craft Museum's successful Art ASPIRE artist residency program, which provides an intense learning experience that is integrated with Brockton's Champion Charter School curriculum. She will talk about the goals of the program and how this *collaboration creates a much-needed space for the exploration of nature as a source of inspiration and self-discovery for urban teens that have little exposure to nature's healing beauty.*

Fuller Craft Museum, New England's only museum of contemporary craft, is dedicated to the objects, ideas, and insight that inspire both patrons and artists to explore life through the art of contemporary craft. Artist: Installation artist Linda Price-Sneddon's Art Aspire program is designed to address the emotional and cognitive development needs of young adults through focused observation sessions held in D.W. Field Park, followed by hands-on studio workshops where the students create art in response to their experience in nature. The lecture will include a slide show presentation and conversation and is part of a full day of events, scheduled to mark the public opening and reception for Fuller Craft Museum's spring exhibitions.
